Land-based youth mental health and addiction facility now open

Treatment model unique in Ontario

LITTLE CURRENT—Gwekwaadziwin Miikan opened its doors last Friday, May 25 inviting Islanders to meet staff, tour the facility and learn more about the programs offered. UCCM Police hosted a lunch fish fry and Gwekwaadziwin's culinary specialist prepared a variety of traditional foods.

The first intake for this unique program began Monday, May 28. The intake process is ongoing with a few spots still available for the live in aftercare phase. The land-based training program is scheduled to launch on June 11.

Staff worked closely with the Pine River Institute, a residential treatment centre located in Dufferin County near Shelbourne for youth aged 13 to 19 years who are struggling with addictions or mental health issues. Staff were able to adapt the Pine River model and integrate it into an Anishinabek culture-based program.

The Pine River program was the first of its kind in Canada and uses a four-stage approach to treatment that combines wilderness, residence, transition and aftercare support. "Our program contains three phases: land-based treatment, live in aftercare and community aftercare," said Sam Gilchrist, executive director.

The goal of the three-month long land based treatment (LBT) phase is stabilization, emotional growth, self-management skills and social skills. LBT incorporates outdoor experiential learning, combining therapeutic techniques with Anishinabek culture and conducted completely in the wilderness.

The live-in aftercare phase runs from six months to one year, providing a stable environment for participants to continue developing and practicing therapeutic and life skills. Participants are encouraged to attend regular groups and one-on-one counselling while attending work, school or volunteer opportunities.

The third phase is community aftercare and assists with participants' reintegration into their community. This phase lasts six months and includes a gradual transition to either independent living or living with their family and full reintegration into their community. Participants will be offered appropriate referrals to community services and peer support groups and staff will maintain contact and offer support via meetings, phone, text message and social media.

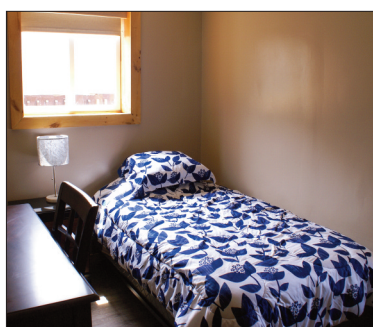
"The program has two streams," Mr. Gilchrist explained, "the Four Directions stream for 13- to 19-year-olds and the Seven Grandfathers stream for 19- to 30-year-olds. Unfortunately, we're only funded right now for the 19- to 30-year-old stream, the Seven Grandfathers stream, but we continue to advocate for the 13- to 19-year-old stream. All of our programming is based upon best practices and we'll do some comparative measurements so we can illustrate that we're doing a good job, that we've created a change in individuals and within communities."

"I came on board in 2015," he continued. "This wouldn't have happened without the advocacy of the current chiefs and the past chiefs as well because

New housing model for subsidized rentals may cause fiscal woes to main client group

Subsidy could decrease by 30 percent

ESPANOLA—Officials at the Manitoulin Sudbury District Services Board (DSB) are waiting on clarity as to how the new federal housing benefit program will impact those who depend on housing subsidies, and the potential for unintended consequences has the DSB concerned.

DSB CEO Fern Dominelli highlighted the potential conundrum to members of the board at its May 24 meeting in Espanola following a report by Director of Integrated Social Services Donna Stewart.

"The federal government has announced a Canada Housing Benefit that would provide 300,000 households with financial assistance," said Ms. Stewart. "The federal government will allocate \$4 billion for the Canada Housing Benefit, which will help families by providing an average rent subsidy of \$2,500 annually beginning in April 2020 and concluding in 2028."

The concerns arise from a lack of details and a potential to derail the DSB's own, more practical program designed to meet local needs.

"There are no specific details on how the Canada Housing Benefit would be calculated," noted Ms. Stewart, "but at an average rent subsidy of \$2,500 annually that will provide \$208 per month and the current DSB program already pays to a maximum of \$3,600 annually, or \$300 a month."

Ontario will be launching the

Portable Housing Benefit (PHB) program to help people find safe and affordable housing beyond the traditional rent-g geared-to-income (RGI) social housing assistance. Ms. Stewart explained that a "portable" housing benefit is "a monthly benefit (housing allowance) provided to a low-income household to assist with

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just. That all portfolios governing our day-to-day life, from education to energy, are provincial jurisdiction, while “Indians and land reserved for Indians” was put under federal jurisdiction is clearly racist policy and must end today.

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ted to a Treaty Strategy that: promotes public awareness on treaties; facilitates constructive engagement on treaties; revitalizes treaty relationships; and promotes improved socio-economic outcomes for Indigenous peoples.

The Liberals worked with Indigenous and other partners to revise the provincial curriculum to include Indigenous cultures and histories—a very crucial step in increasing public awareness of the importance of treaties in Ontario. this advocacy had been going on for five years prior to that.”

Hazel Recollet, chief executive officer of United Chiefs and Councils of Mniidoo Mnising (UCCMM) noted, “He (Sam) knows this place inside and out. We worked really hard to get Sam on board. He took it by the horns and brought this place together. We’ve had lots of meetings with the government to secure a large portion of funding. We’re really proud he got it up and running. All the chiefs of UCCMM worked really hard to make this a reality. I commend them for this. They were very diligent. Joe Hare was instrumental in the development of Gwekwaadziwin Miikan.”

Mr. Hare, a former UCCMM tribal chair and also a former chief of M’Chigeeng First Nation (MFN), explained, “At least six years ago I saw the need to provide better help to people addicted to alcohol or drugs. I thought of an Anishinabek treatment facility which is unique to First Nations in that cultural teachings were the basis. I took it to (MFN) council and they thought it was a good idea. At first it was just for MFN but we could tell as the years went by and the program worked that there was a need to provide these services for the region. We took it to UCCMM so others could have access to the services. The result of that was the development of a steering committee. It took a long time to get support from the government but it finally happened and here we are today. It took all that time. This is the beginning of it.”

Gwekwaadziwin Miikan is located on land owned by Aundeck Omni Kaning (AOK) on Highway 540 west of the main community settlement. The home was originally a private residence but was transformed into a daycare and then a group home following its purchase by AOK. The treatment facility is its fourth incarnation and is where the live in after-care phase will be housed.

Separate one-time funding dollars were received to get the program set up.

Those dollars were utilized to set up the portable building (where the administration offices are located) and get some of the infrastructure pieces completed, including installation of a new septic system. While the facility does have a homey atmosphere, there is a CCTV surveillance system in place. “The safety of our participants and our staff is a priority,” said Mr. Gilchrist.

The portable will also be used as a meeting space. “Essentially our land based treatment counsellors are out on the land seven days at a time and then they’re off for a couple of days,” continued Mr. Gilchrist. “Then they’re in here so we can have our clinical meetings. We can have meaningful dialogue about the participants that are on the program and how we can best envelope them within a holistic model here.”

Inside the multi-level facility are two multi-purpose rooms; kitchen, dining and laundry facilities; five single occupancy rooms on the lower floor for females; and three double occupancy rooms on the upper floor for males.

“Every part of the program is experiential so we’ve got room for our participants to sit down but also for our staff to sit down with them and really work on that therapeutic alliance and building relationships on every level of the program,” explained Mr. Gilchrist. “We’re here role modeling about how we want our participants to act and so our staff is acting in those appropriate ways on every level and something as simple as eating meals as well.”

The room on the upper landing is a multi-purpose TV room. “It’s where our traditional knowledge keepers work out of,” Mr. Gilchrist said. “We’ve been

very fortunate in that we’ve got terrific traditional knowledge keepers who have been able to build up our staff’s knowledge base and of course they’re going to be able to work with our participants as well. So we’ve been doing a lot of work with regards to learning about medicines and those different culture pieces as well.”

“Essentially, we work from the client-centred model of care. We’re not trying to come at treatment with a cookie cutter approach. We’re looking at each participant as a unique individual and trying to create a treatment plan that fits their unique needs. Of course we’re also using trauma informed practice to understand the needs that might need to be met due to acute, chronic and intergenerational trauma and we’re also utilizing what is called a maturity model. Essentially, the tenets of the maturity model are that if something has occurred (such as trauma) to stagnate an individual’s maturity, we’re working with them on their own identity and growing that maturity to a more socially acceptable level.”

During the open house, staff members provided skills demonstrations, shared stories and sang songs in tipis as well as answered questions about the program. Team leader Matt shared, “The amount of skillset that we have in each of our staff is very unique. You won’t really see this at most of the basic or standard treatment programs. You need to know your survival skills. You need to know how to respond in dangerous situations and you can’t really have a rigid structure because you need to be adaptable to whatever Mother Earth gives you

that day. We have no idea what we’re going to face on a day-to-day basis as far as the natural environment goes so we’ve given a lot of flexibility to the LBT counselors within the program we’ve designed. That being said, there are things that we plan on doing. The Redpath model, for example, which is the addictions counselling component, and there’s also the survival component on top of that.”

The Redpath model is a unique program that was developed by Peggy Shaughnessy, a PhD stu-

Detachment where an investigation was initiated.

Members of the Sudbury OPP Crime Unit worked with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) and the International Criminal Police Organization (Interpol) to alert Polish authorities of the threats. The Polish police went on to investigate the incident.

Detective Inspector Todd Proulx, manager of Criminal Operations in North East

Region said, "I am pleased that a member of the public came forward to warn police about a potential school violence threat. Although this incident was international, police organizations work together around the world to maintain public safety."

housing costs," she said. "Unlike other forms of housing assistance the (portable) benefit is tied to the household and not a physical housing unit allowing the benefit to move with the household. The portable housing benefit would give people more flexibility to choose where they live, while encouraging economic and social inclusion (integrating households into the broader neighbourhoods rather than ghettoized in a low rental complex)."

With its focus on flexibility, the PHB may well be the best approach to providing assistance to households for many families, while the traditional RGI model may be more appropriate to others. The combination of the two systems provides managers with a range of tools. But there is a bit of a catch.

"The PHB only accounts for the actual rent paid and does not include any additional amounts paid by the tenant for heat, hydro or other utility costs," said Ms. Stewart. "This is of particular concern in Northern Ontario where natural gas is not available in many communities and Hydro One rates are exorbitant. Creating a provincial PHB that does not consider the total actual cost of the accommodations paid for by the tenant, including heat, hydro and any other utilities, is a real concern for Northerners."

The biggest difference between the proposed new provincial program and the one currently offered by the DSB is that the DSB model does take those other factors into account.

The current DSB program uses a mix of municipal and provincial dollars to provide its program to those in need of assistance. A breakdown of costs was included in Ms. Stewart's presentation: municipal share of \$149,083; Community Homelessness Prevention Initiative share of \$295,268; and the Investment in Affordable Housing Fund portion of \$121,678 for a total of \$566,029.

When it comes to impact, however, the devil is in the details. "We are currently providing direct shelter subsidy to approximately 180 families with these funds," said Ms. Stewart. "If the province informs us that we can no longer operate the DSB direct shelter subsidy and that we must abide the (provincial) PHB formula, it would have the following effects on our current 180 families: 32 families (18 percent) would lose their housing benefit, 94 families (52 percent) would qualify, but at a much reduced rate because any

amounts paid by the tenant for heat, hydro or other utilities are not included in the PHB; 15 families (8 percent) would see no change as their rent includes all utilities; and 39 families (22 percent) would be at an advantage, however the amount of money allocated to them would not include the full shelter costs."

The bottom line is that, if the current formula remains in place and the DSB is forced to drop its program in favour of the new provincial plan, 126 families (70 percent) would be worse off.

"If we get into funding capping (at the \$208 level) we may have clients who are worse off," noted Mr. Dominelli. In addition, if the current program does not provide enough of a shelter to bridge the divide it may prove to be essentially a waste of money.


"If you are shut out at \$500, it could just leave you half way across the ditch," he said. "We could just be floating pennies on the ocean." In the DSB program, the rent subsidy is only given out if it will actually meet the needs of the recipient—if it falls too far short to do any good it doesn't come about.

Recognizing that a one-size-fits-all province-wide program does not work well for Northern Ontario, particularly for small rural and remote communities, the DSB passed a motion to bring its concerns to the

upper tier government in hopes of retaining the flexibility to meet local needs.

tion demands a lot more than ceremonies and symbolic gestures. It demands good faith—and it demands action.

ous that dependence on government support and control has failed miserably. Too many First Nations people are suffering. "Remember those moves," Ms. Kuntsi said, "cuz we'll be dancing more later. For our first stellar performance of the day," she went on to say, "I would like to introduce Danny Lamb. He has shared the stage with acts such as Mother Mother, Trooper, Marianas Trench, Fefe Dobson and David Wilcox. Danny is here today to help you realize that music can be a powerful tool to bring positive change."

Mr. Lamb is a musician with the band The Association. He has spina bifida/hydrocephalus and has had brain surgery, including a shunt that broke twice, that put an end to his love of soccer. "I had lost everything that made me who I am," he said, but a Rotary trip to Brazil changed that. He became an ambassador for spina bifida and his music led to the WE movement. Mr. Lamb showed his prowess with a soccer ball while talking to the students and explaining that music bridges the gap between people.

The next guest welcomed to Manitoulin was rapper A. Persona who is also a songwriter and you tuber on a mission to ignite moments of optimism and joy one rhyme at a time. She left the Philippines to move to Canada and suffered alone from high functioning depression for a long time. She drops a tune every Tuesday on YouTube and has had sold out concerts in Toronto and Niagara Falls while she works on a university degree in math. "I am HIV positive," Ms. Murphy said. "I was born with it. My late mother was a drug addict and an alcoholic. We both had full blown AIDS. I was considered terminally ill, and then the amazing Murphy family came along. I am the second oldest of 10 kids. I was told I was HIV positive when I was seven-years-old." Ms. Murphy faced discrimination when people learned that she was HIV positive. This made her want to speak out.

"At age 10," she said, "I started speaking out at small conferences and then We Day asked me to speak in Ottawa. I found my voice through speaking." Ms. Murphy has spoken about her condition and the obstacles she overcame in Kenya, Ethiopia and will soon journey to Ecuador.

"Yes," she went on to say, "I have gone through a lot, but I am still here. I urge you to speak out about what you are passionate about. You can do anything you put your mind to."

Ashley Quackenbush, an Islander and former MSS and SHARE alumni, also spoke at the seminar. She has worked with WE for many years and is an advocate for mental

health.

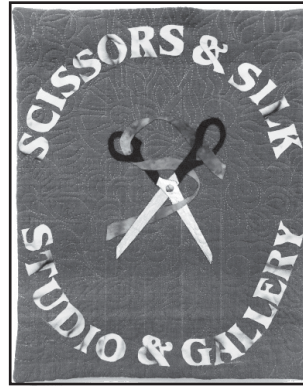



Northern municipalities, with the exception of NEMI, vote in favour of HST hike

 PARRY SOUND—A contingent from the Town of Northeastern Manitoulin and the Islands, among other Island municipalities, recently attended the annual general meeting of the Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM) and were among the very few who voted against a motion approving a suggested hike to the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) of one percent.

Resolution 2018-03 was among a spate of resolutions voted on at the AGM

which reads:

“Whereas the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) has led the call to action for a one percent increase in the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) that would be dedicated to municipal infrastructure; and whereas projections have indicated that for the next 10 years there is an average annual need of \$4.9 billion to fix local infrastructure and provide for municipal operating needs; and whereas this gap assumes all existing and multi-year planned federal

and provincial transfers to municipal governments will be fulfilled and maintained at current levels; and whereas municipal governments have limited authority in their ability to reduce the cost of delivering municipal services and financing infrastructure projects; and whereas a one percent increase to the provincial portion of the HST, adjusted for low income rebates, would result in about \$2.5 billion in new revenue that would be distributed equitably to help every municipal gov-

ernment in Ontario fund their infrastructure and services with greater predictability; and therefore be it resolved that FONOM supports a one percent increase to the HST that would be dedicated to municipal infrastructure.”

Northeast Town Mayor Al MacNevin told The Expositor that FONOM was ready to pass the motion without a vote and that he had to request a vote on the tax hike.

“This (resolution), for a while now, they’ve been pumping it up,” Mayor

MacNevin said of AMO.

The mayor said AMO had been holding sessions on the tax hike across the province, and he attended the one in Sudbury this winter.

New website seeks Manitoulin Island experiences, and tourists

LITTLE CURRENT—Performance artist Mariana Lafrance has a lot of irons in the fire, not only is she an active working artist with creative performance collaborations with organizations like Le Théâtre du Nouvel-Ontario and painting exhibits at galleries across the province, she has now created a site to market Manitoulin experiences to visiting tourists with the intriguing name YEMMI.

“The site is kind of like a matchmaker between Islanders who are doing interesting things and people coming to the Island,” she explained.

The concept was born when Ms. Lafrance, who often travels to urban areas as part of her artistic endeavours, noticed that whenever her downtown friends (or is it uptown? Well, urbanites in any event.) heard what her life on Manitoulin Island is like they become fascinated. “I hang around the Tilson homestead (home base for the Northern Ontario Permaculture Research Institute) quite a bit and there are always a lot of very different things going on. We have it very good here on the Island and people are often envious of the lifestyle,” she noted. “There are so many activi-

ties we do here that city folks don't have access to.” Simple things like feeding the chickens or watching a porcupine climb precariously out on a tree limb in the back yard. When I am in Toronto I see people's eyes light up when I tell them about the things I am doing and the things my friends are doing.”

It was while she was creating a small website for her own offerings that Ms. Lafrance realized that providing a service that would connect people with Island experiences to people who want to have the opportunity to experience them would “be wonderful.” So she decided to open it up to the larger Island communi-

ty.

“It will be good for people who already have a business and also good for people who are just thinking about it,” she said. “It can work for one-time events, ongoing experiences or custom ones that are designed for the individual customer.”

There is no membership fee to register for the website, but if a booking is made through the site, Ms. Lafrance would take a small commission. Those commissions would start as low as 10 percent depending on the frequency and other factors customized to the provider. “It helps to pay for the upkeep and creation of the site,” she said.

In the meantime, Ms. Lafrance is working on another completely different bit of industry—she is creating backpacks and custom bags of her own design online.

Ms. Lafrance hands out her business card for YEMMI and one of the first things one notices is

that there is no phone number on the card, just an email address. “It's strictly an online business,” she said. “It's like this studio, it isn't a retail location. Everything happens online.”

As for the name of the website, YEMMI, the source is quite simple and sensible when explained. “YEM are the call letters for the Manitoulin East Municipal Airport and the MI stands for Manitoulin Island,” she explained. The website can be found at yemmi.ca.

...continued from page 11 dent from Trent University in Peterborough. Ms. Shaughnessy piloted a needs assessment through the Psychology Department and the Emotional Health Lab with Dr. James Parker at Trent, working with inmates at Kingston Penitentiary and Warkworth Institution. From that, she created Redpath which looks at emotional and social competencies and gets to the root of the problem based on the premise that addiction is not the problem, the problem is why people are addicted. Traditional treatments focus on behaviour avoidance while Redpath looks at the root causes of the behaviour.

The staff is very excited to get out there and apply their training, said Matt. “I’ve been here for five or six weeks at this point. We jumped right into it. Some people have been here longer, maybe three or four months. It’s just been non-stop going until we had the full complement (of 23 full-time staff). We’re really banking on a strong support staff as well for the casual pool just to ensure we have the supports required to give our staff that kind of relief as needed as well. So we’re there, we’re ready to go.”

He continued, “It’s really being approached in a good way. I’ve seen, just in my own experience, a number of programs that try to sprinkle in their cultural component but Sam has done an amazing job of making that the foundation of the program. We’re trying to start everything in a good way from our medicines to just even in the way we communicate and applying those kind of Grandfather teachings and being open to that. It’s just being done with good minds and good hearts. It’s really good to see that as the foundation (of the program) as opposed to just another mainstream program with a little bit of culture sprinkled into it. I think that will be the biggest difference in the success of the program.”

awareness about spina bifi-da and also so that others with the condition will know that they are not alone.

Marnie Brown, the executive director of Manitoulin Family Resources (MFR) outlined the programs of this organization and spoke of the poverty in Manitoulin communities. She remarked that the World Health Organization (WHO) states that poverty is the single largest detriment to health. She went on to say that 499,415 people used a food bank in Ontario in 2017 with one in three people being children. She made special mention of the MSS Scare Away Hunger Drive and said that the Stuff the Bus campaign that the schools did was the largest campaign she had ever seen. She also talked of the MFR Christmas Hamper Campaign where volunteers prepare 842 food hampers. Ms. Brown told her audience that the fastest growing demographic on Manitoulin is homelessness. Like the other speakers, Ms. Brown also had a message for the students. “Volunteer at a food bank,” she

said. “Be part of a food drive. Listen to a friend.”

The final performer was a Bryce Mastelko, an athlete, musician and MSS alumni. He is presently at Laurentian University and shared his love of music with the students and faculty.

Ms. Kuntsi closed We Day Manitoulin by asking the students to “remember today as the day you were inspired to make a difference to your community. Any action is big to someone.”

Did you know?

The SPUD unit at the New Liskeard Agricultural Research Station, University of Guelph provides Ontario growers and researchers a unique resource to obtain truly clean seed for some vegeta-

tively propagated crops. The SPUD unit was established in 1983 to service the seed potato industry and is still in operation today. Some crops, like potatoes, have a certified seed program which is federally regulated and has set limits on how much disease and virus can be tolerated. There are also seed classes based on age and disease/virus levels. The University of Guelph, New Liskeard Agricultural Research Station is a unique and special resource that is available to Canadian growers. Since 1983, the SPUD Unit has helped create clean seed for many horticultural crops. It has been a breeding site for strawberries and a winter hardiness of both strawberries and raspberries. Field production research has included trials for cucumber, tomato, sweet corn, bok choy, cauliflower, cabbage, broccoli, green beans and garlic.

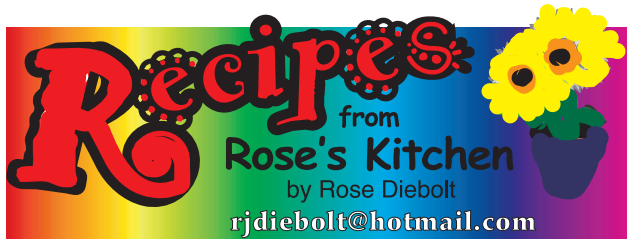

Wow, that was a quick change in weather. We jumped from winter into summer and my vegetable and herb plants are just sooo happy. You can see them grow from one day to the next. I planted a new variety of kale this year. It is called Tronchuda kale or Portuguese kale and its claim to fame is that it is heat resistant. The leaves look like lily pads and are sweet and mild flavoured. Unlike other kales, Tronchuda resists the summer heat very well. It is a Portuguese favourite used in the national dish a soup called Caldo Verde. We have been eating kale the last week because I jump started the season by starting the seeds under my grow light and they will be a regular in my garden.

Don't forget to buy some herbs and plant them wherever you can. It will make such a difference in your cooking and also the pesto you are going to make for the long winter!! (Not to worry, I will remind you later.)

Asparagus with Green Dressing

Asparagus is one of the easiest vegetables to cook with lots of flavour. I like to add a dressing for extra flavour and color. The recipe calls for spinach in which I didn't have enough from my garden so I added the extra amount using the Tronchuda kale.

1 lb fresh asparagus washed, with tough ends broken off
Salt and pepper
1/4 cup sunflower seed or olive oil
Preheat oven 350°F.

Place the asparagus on a parchment lined cookie sheet and pour the oil on top of the asparagus. Roll the asparagus back and forth until all the spears are covered in oil. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and place in the oven. Bake until crisp, tender about 10 minutes. Meanwhile make the dressing.

Green Dressing

2 cups spinach
2 green onions or green garlic
2 cloves garlic
1/3 cup olive oil
1/4 cup organic apple cider vinegar
3 Tbsp maple syrup or honey
Salt and pepper to taste

Place everything in a blender and blend. Just like that, all done. You have your dressing which you can serve on the side with the asparagus or pour it over top of the asparagus before serving.

***This dressing is excellent for a salad.

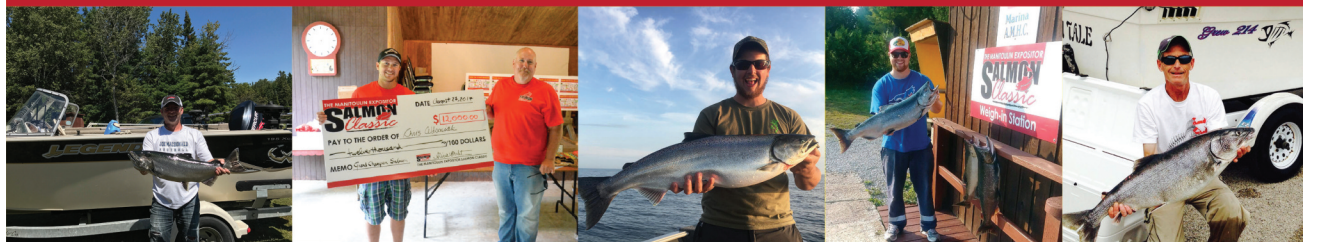
