Lion President Bruce took a moment from his busy schedule to stop by The Expositor office to reflect on another great year of Lionism and the Haweater ahead.

The president said he was pleased to announce the introduction of a pedestrian mall in downtown Little Current this year with the closure of the main street on Saturday and Sunday. Almost all of the events, with the exception of some being held at Low Island, will be held on the main drag with the hope of creating a more festival-like atmosphere. With vendors and the amazing wares on offer by downtown businesses, there will be plenty of great shopping to be had. On both Saturday and Sunday, the club is hosting inflatable family fun—a new edition to the weekend—as well as a dunk tank. There may be some special local celebrities willing to get wet for a donation to the Lions, so stay tuned for more details, Lion President Bruce urged.

"We are hoping to make the downtown a family atmosphere with picnic tables along the main street so people can sit and eat or just visit with old friends and new," he added.

Another new edition to the weekend is more live music. As usual, and back by popular demand, the talented duo of Jamie Mohamed and Peter Nelson as The Uppers will kick off the weekend fun downtown at the Cenotaph following the opening ceremonies and again on Sunday in the late afternoon before the Much-Music street dance begins, again at the Cenotaph.

Evan Farquhar and Damien Thibodeau will be showing off their musical stylings at the Low Island Lions Pavilion on Friday night at 8 pm and again on Saturday at 2 pm-a duo not to be missed.

There will also be yet more live musical entertainment downtown on Saturday afternoon with a band to be announced.

And speaking of musical talent, the president could not say enough about Miss Manitoulin 2014 Katie Harper who has won Manitoulin over with her charm and talent, winning the Miss North Ontario talent component earlier this spring and moving on to represent Manitoulin at Miss Teenage Canada in Toronto next month.


"She's been absolutely amazing and a great ambassador for Manitoulin," Lion President Bruce said.

Hot rods and hot wheels set to invade Water Street

LITTLE CURRENT--The Little Current Lions and the Rainbow Country Cruisers are finalizing the preparations for the 13th Annual Haweater Cruise-In scheduled for Saturday, August 1 of Haweater Weekend.


Water Street will be closed from the Bank of Montreal east to Campbell Street to accommodate the car show. Classic cars from across Manitoulin Island and Northeastern Ontario will cruise in to Little Current's waterfront and will be on display for viewing from 10 am to 3 pm. Shortly after 3 pm, the cars will cruise through Little Current to the Centennial Manor parking lot for the Manor residents to view.

This year's show is expected to have everything from a Ford Model A to a new Dodge Challenger SRT Hellcat featuring a 707 horsepower 6.2 liter supercharged hemi. The Cruise-In has grown to just over 100 cars and features some very rare cars and some of the nicest hot rods in the Northeast. Admission to the public is free of charge, however there will be a silver collection container present if people


wish to make a contribution. All proceeds from the Cruise-In will be donated to local charities. Last year's proceeds went to the Centennial Manor. To date the Cruise-In has raised \$20,000 over 12 years to local charities and a large amount of non-perishable food has been donated to the Manitoulin Foodbank.

During the Cruise-In, the Kids' Hot Wheels Racing will be taking place and action is bound to be fast and furious. The NBS Auto drag track will be set up in the NAPA parking lot with registration at 11:30 am and racing starting at noon. NAPA Drag Racing Official Brian Garinger will once again be on hand to over see the drag racing action. Kids are encouraged to bring out a hot wheels car and join in the action. There will be awards, prizes, treats and fun for all participants.

Brittany Manitowabi is 19-years-old and heading into her second year at Laurentian University in social work. Hailing from Wik-



Little Ray's Reptile Zoo returns to Haweater by popular demand

LITTLE CURRENT—The sense of excitement is palpable in the audience as parents and children wait for the show to begin. There might even be a little trepidation in the eyes of some of the parents, but Little Ray's Reptile Zoo's 'Diversity of Living Things' travelling roadshow has proven to be one of the most popular events taking place during the Little Current Lions Club Haweater Weekend.

'This exhibit and show highlight the incredible diversity of species that we are blessed to have on our planet," said Steph Boardman, wildlife educator with Little Ray's Reptile Zoo. 

Manitoulin's original cardboard boat race celebrates 12 years this Haweater

LITTLE CURRENT—A lot of duct tape goes into 12 years of cardboard boots

One of Haweater Weekend's signature events, the cardboard boat races held each year on the festival Saturday, is marking its 12th year in 2015 and the Lions Club couldn't be happier.

Organizers Amanda Roy and Lion Alicia McCutcheon explained that the event actually first started as a way to mark the very first Mac-Man Challenge with the Lions realizing its potential and quickly scooping it up, with the Little Current Yacht Club's blessing, and making it their own.

"It's been so much fun," Lion Alicia said. "When you see the throngs of people lining the shore, all beaming from ear to ear and shouting their encouragement at the cardboard boaters, it just makes you happy."

makes you happy."

"It's so true," Ms. Roy added. "Especially when you see all the hard work and effort that goes into building a boat, and the teamwork too."

Throughout the years the number of entries has

between 25 and 30 each year and in the four categories: 8 to 11, 12 to 15, 16 plus and business challenge. A two-person crew is encouraged, but if you'd rather go solo, that's just fine. There are prizes, generously sponsored by the Lions Club, for first, second and third in the age categories, a trophy for the business challenge (that the winning team gets to keep all year) and lifejackets for the winners of the Titanic Award (for the boat with the most spectacular sinking). There is also a prize for

the best decorated boat, and there are some real beauts—before they hit the water!

Judges also do a check of all the boats before the race begins to check for contraband items. As the name implies, the boats must only be made of cardboard (no waxed cardboard or sonotubes) and duct tape. Latex paint for decoration is allowed. The paddle blades must be made of only cardboard and duct tape, but the shaft can be made from wood, such as sawed off hockey sticks.

Raft designs are also not permitted. The boat must be exactly that, a vessel with a stern, bow, port and starboard sides.

Keep in mind that it takes some time to build a boat, so get building and see you at Haweater Weekend!
